

# The 750 Walsingham Trial – Event Report

Walsingham greeted competitors in the traditional British fashion — with rain. Plenty of it overnight.

The opening round was properly greasy. Slippery chalk and clay, shiny cambers, leaf mould, and the sort of grip levels that make you question every life decision halfway up a climb. The rain finally stopped around 11am and, as the day progressed, the ground began to dry slightly for rounds two and three. The sections were eased a touch, but most still demanded momentum, finesse, and mechanical sympathy rather than brute force.

Some drivers adapted beautifully.

Others... less so.

## ■ Overall Result

A hugely popular and long-overdue victory went to **Ian Wright (Sherpa 1500)** with a winning total of **65**.

Ian drove with calm authority throughout the day. While others were collecting 7s, 8s, and the occasional adventurous 10, Ian kept things tidy where it mattered. A superb climb on *Paul Faulkner's Hill 2* proved decisive and kept him firmly in contention.

It has been a long time since his last win — and this one was well worth the wait.

Second overall was reigning British Champion **Thomas Bricknell (Crossle 1500)** on **70**.

Thomas kept the pressure on throughout and even won Round 1. However, as conditions evolved, he let things slip slightly in the latter stages and, on this occasion, had to settle for the **Red Independent** class win rather than the overall honours.

Third overall went to **Stuart Beare (Sherpa 1500)** on **85**.

Renowned for thriving in wet conditions, Stuart looked composed all day. Whether he was unlucky in the morning slime — or simply not quite able to match the leading pace — he remained firmly in contention during rounds two and three to secure an excellent podium finish.

## ■ “Character Building” Moments

The conditions caught plenty of drivers out — particularly in the opening round.

- **Trevor Wood** posted a round one total of 82 and finished on 201 — proof that Walsingham was not feeling charitable.
- **Colin Seaward** ended the day on 220 — and may still be cleaning mud out of places previously thought sealed.
- **James Hepburn** (208) encountered at least one hill that clearly preferred Sherpas stationary.
- Several drivers flirted with double-figure section scores in Round 1 — a clear sign that enthusiasm briefly outweighed available traction.
- A respectful nod also goes to those who recorded Retirements/Non-Starts, including **Mike Readings** and **Dave Overy**. Sometimes discretion really is the better part of valour.
