Sunday 24th November 2024

Supplementary Regulations

1. The BTRDA will organise a Clubmans permit Sporting Trial on **Sunday 24th November 2024** at **Eaton, near Grantham, NG32 1SF** (please note this is not precisely the trial site - see SR29 for directions).
2. The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), by these Supplementary Regulations and by any other written instructions that the Organising Club may issue for this event.
3. Motorsport UK Permit Number is: 200844
4. The event is open to all fully elected members of the Organising Club, Midlands Trials Car Club, NPTCC, 750 Motor Club, Kentish Border Car Club, Camel Vale Motor Club, Launceston & North Cornwall Motor Club, Ross & District Motor Sports Club and registered contenders in the Motorsport UK British Sporting Trial Championship.
5. All drivers and passengers must produce a valid Club Membership Card at Signing-On, together with a minimum of an RS Clubman Competition Licence issued by Motorsport UK for 2024.
6. The event is a qualifying round of the 2024 Tulleys Farm BTRDA Sporting Trial Championship and the 2024 Motorsport UK British Sporting Trials Championship (Permit No CH2024/T001).
7. Event Programme: Scrutineering and Signing On will start at 9.00am
 Driver's Briefing will be at 10.15am
 The event will start at 10.30am
 Any competitor not signed on by 10.15am may be excluded
8. There will be at least 6 sections on private land – details of the sections will be notified at Signing On/ Driver's Briefing. Public roads will not be used to link sections. The number of rounds will be determined by the weather and size of the entry.
9. The entry will be split into groups starting on different hill sections.
10. Practicing will not be permitted.
11. Competitors will be identified by a number card issued by the Organisers. These, along with Competitor's Score Cards, will be issued at Signing On. Start numbers will be allocated by ballot prior to the event.
12. The event will be divided into the following classes:
 Red Independent Red Live Blue Independent Blue Live
 Rookies Post Historic Clubman - for those not eligible for BTRDA/Post Historic
13. Double-drives will be permitted providing the Secretary is made aware before the entry closing date.
14. All cars must comply with the Motorsport UK Technical Regulations and the Motorsport UK National Trials Car Formula. Permitted tyres for this event are as per the current list: Yokohama GT Classic 350, Maxxis MA-510N, Vredestein T-Trac 2, Nankang CX668. Any cars in the Post Historic class can use tyres in accordance with T14.8.1 and T14.8.2.
15. A minimum tyre pressure will be applied on the day at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course. Checks may be carried out during the event to confirm compliance. A maximum of 12 penalty points can be applied for each breach of the rule.



16. Differentials – all cars except Clubman and Post Historic must have passed the Sharp Differential Test and have the red MSUK seal attached and intact, with a seal number matching the master sheet as required by the BTRDA and Motorsport UK Championships – cars with a “temporary” blue seal are accepted. Only those cars will be eligible to be classified in the results.
17. Awards will be presented as follows:
- 1st Overall
 - 1st Red Independent
 - 1st Red Live
 - 1st Blue Independent
 - 1st Blue Live
 - 1st Rookie
 - 1st Post Historic
 - 1st Clubman

All class awards are subject to a minimum of 4 entries.

18. The maximum entry for the meeting is 50 and the minimum is 20. Should the minimum not be reached then the Organisers reserve the right to cancel the event. Entries will be selected on a ‘first come, first served’ basis.
19. The entry list opens on publication of these Regulations and closes finally at midnight on Wednesday 20th November. All entries must be made via the official entry form and sent to:

Any withdrawal of entries can only be made by email to the Secretary – entries withdrawn before the closing date will be entitled to a full refund, thereafter at the Organisers’ discretion. The Organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry.

21. Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after the event has finished at the venue and sent via email afterwards.
22. Any protests must be lodged in accordance with C5.1 to C5.7.
23. Marking and penalties will be as printed in the appropriate section of the Motorsport UK General Regulations. All other General Regulations of the Motorsport UK apply as written except the following which are modified:

T6.1 Start hills for each round will be notified at the Drivers Briefing and competitors will run in numerical order within each group throughout the event unless instructed otherwise by an official.

T6.3.2 ‘Competitors must attempt to negotiate the observed section non-stop unless the SR’s specify otherwise’. The current BTRDA modified rule known as the “3 second rule” is adopted where there is a



3-second allowance for the competitor to regain forward motion; the marshal will count “and 1 and 2 and 3”. With one exception, should a competitor stall the engine in a section this counts as a stop with no time allowance; the exception is that should the engine stall occur down hill and the car continues forward motion while the competitor restarts the engine, there is no penalty.

24. All marshals are Judges of Fact.
25. No person may drive, or be a passenger in, a competing car on the site unless they are the official crew for that car. The Clerk of the Course is responsible for the safe running of the event.

No marshal or competitor may change a section without the express permission of the Clerk of the Course.

26. Toilets will be provided.
27. There will be a Paramedic in attendance.
28. Final Instructions will be emailed out after the closing date.
29. The event will be held at Eaton, near Grantham.

An approximate post code is NG32 1SF – Main Street, Eaton - but be aware that this won't lead exactly to the right gate entrance.

For 'what3words', use *congested.havens.dressings*.

Please **avoid the village of Eaton** as the roads are very narrow and twisty – this is requested for the goodwill to all residents and preserve the continued use of the site. Kindly approach the site from Eastwell, taking Scaford Road then Main Street. Turn right at staggered crossroads towards Eaton/ Branston. The site is approximately 0.4mile from crossroads on the left (and before Eaton village).

The BTRDA are grateful to Andy Shipman for the use of his land, also the Paramedic and all marshals/officials for their time in making the event possible.
